Our challenges have been many: procuring and paying for PPE and testing; construction next to Hospice Austin's Christopher House which limited our available beds; a 55% increase in patients with no insurance or other funding; an increase in competition from for-profit hospices; and the cancellation of our primary fundraiser, the Beauty of Life brunch.

We need our friends more than ever and I am so thankful for all of you. Your support allows us to continue our mission of serving all who need us, regardless of whether they have COVID or another disease, and regardless of their ability to pay. We are able to be there for them, because you have been there for us. Thank you.

Hospice Austin 2020 Program Highlights

- Hospice Austin served 2,461 patients and their families in 2020.
- Hospice Austin staff provided more than 100,000 visits to patients and families.
- Average daily census was 415 patients per day.
- Average length of stay was 66 days; the median length of stay was 14 days.
- We cared for 98 patients with COVID-19.
- In 2020, Hospice Austin provided nearly \$1.5 million in uncompensated care to patients with no source of funding.



Bereavement

Our bereavement program provides support following the patient's passing. In 2020:

- Facilitated 259 support group sessions and grief webinars for 236 people
- 219 people attended 1,466 individual counseling sessions
- 815 people attended 15 community grief presentations
- Made 2,395 phone calls to bereaved family and friends and answered 1,160 phone calls asking for support
- Sent 13,874 mailings to 1,982 bereaved family and friends
- 29 children and teens attended our virtual bereavement camp camp at no cost to their families

Palliative Care Provider Visits

Palliative medicine focuses on improving the quality of life for patients with a serious illness. Hospice Austin's palliative care doctors and nurse practitioners made 4,694 visits to Hospice Austin patients in 2020, providing expert relief of pain, nausea, shortness of breath, fatigue, anxiety and depression.

Austin Palliative Care is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Hospice Austin. Besides seeing Hospice Austin patients, we also provide palliative care to patients with a serious illness who are not receiving hospice services.

Volunteer Services

Volunteers are partners in all aspects of Hospice Austin's services and are vital members of the team of caregivers for patients and families. This year, we sharply curtailed the use of volunteers working directly with patients in order to keep everyone safe. However, volunteers still put in many hours making porch visits, delivering items, making phone calls, providing music from outside, and working in the garden at Christopher House. We also include social work and bereavement interns in our volunteer hours. The value of volunteer hours for comparable services to Hospice Austin totaled \$178,813 in saved labor costs. In 2020, volunteers provided:

- 2,397 patient care hours (431 out-patient; 1,966 in-patient)
- 3,824 hours of work for the Bereavement Department
- 596 hours of work for the Development Department
- 401 hours of work by Hospice Austin's Board of Directors and the Hospice Austin Fund Board of Directors

The GIFT Project -Giving Instructions for Tomorrow

Thanks to a generous grant from the St. David's Foundation, Hospice Austin created The GIFT Project to educate both the public and the health care community about the importance of advance care planning *prior* to a health care crisis. In 2020, more than 970 community members and healthcare professionals attended presentations where they learned how to speak with loved ones, select a medical power of attorney, and complete their advance directives.

Uncompensated Care


Hospice Austin serves 100% of those who come to us for care. Unlike most other hospices, we do not put a cap on the amount of care we provide to uninsured and underinsured patients. In 2020, we provided \$1,429,303 in uncompensated care to patients with inadequate or no insurance.

The pandemic exacerbated food insecurity across the region.


